### Mission Statement

The Church of Nativity Social Justice Directory seeks to help parishioners find ways to make Jesus' answers to these questions part of their own lives and to find communities which will help sustain their efforts to live out the Gospel message. As Pope John Paul II said in his Encyclical Letter, *Mane Nobiscum Domine*, such ways "will be the criterion by which the authenticity of our Eucharistic celebrations is judged."<sup>1</sup> The directory will grow as the efforts of parishioners in other activities are recognized.

### How to Use the Directory

The directory consists of two parts. Part I describes organizations within Nativity Parish that are involved in social outreach activities. The mission of the Religious Education Program is to proclaim Christ's message and help students apply it to their lives, to foster community, prayer, worship, and the desire to serve among those we teach. Christian instruction is provided to more than 1,300 students from kindergarten through grade 12 who meet in class once a week for one and one-quarter hours from September through May. In addition to a full curriculum of Catholic Education, students are presented with opportunities to learn how to help others in a real sense through service projects for families, Church, and community. For example, a minimum of 15 hours of service is required of students in the Confirmation Preparation

Program as part of each Confirmation's maturation into the adult Christian life of service to others. Opportunities for all students and families in the Religious Education Program include:

- Participation in Nativity's Operation Starfish® through individual donations and class projects
- Collection of non-perishable food items to be included in holiday food baskets for Nativity families experiencing financial hardship
- Fund raising project during Advent for Handmaids of Reparation to help fund the education of children and adults in poor economic areas around the globe

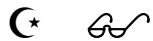

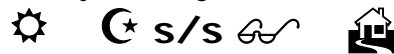
